Not only was there tough competition throughout the week of the tournament, but there was an added Texas Holdem tournament in the Hotel bar on the Sunday before the start of the week's events and a delicious meal, fabulous entertainment by Locomotion and lots of camaraderie at the Polish Legion Branch 412 on Friday night, and ending the week with our very classy ride to the airport in a limousine bus. As so many of us can appreciate, it takes lots of hard work and dedicated volunteers to make this National event successful, and the OSA not only succeeded but also made these Canadians a memorable one. Special thanks to Audrey who did an amazing job with the tournament draw, to Geoff who was a very gracious Hospitality Room host, and to Rico and Theresa, Brenda, Claude and Helen, and so many others. Also, kudos to OSA for recruiting so many great sponsors who play an extremely important role in giving host charters the ability to choose great venues such as the Holiday Inn. As the double round robin, playoffs and congratulations came to a close, a wonderful Awards Banquet was held in the Ontario Ballroom with the recognition of all participants at the Canadians, followed by the main presentations to our Canadian Champions of 2006 (more details on page 5 & 6), and ending with the induction of Rico Beaulieu into the Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame as a Player and a Builder. Thank you OSA.

Bill, Carol, David, Vern, Marion and many other members of the Shuffleboard Association of Alberta (SAA) have their plans well underway for the 2007 Canadians being held in Edmonton, Alberta. We were advised by Bill at the 2006 CSC AGM that the 2007 Canadians will be held at the Executive Hotels & Resorts which is just minutes away from the World's largest Mall & Amusement Centre, West Edmonton Mall, and with great room rates starting at \$88 (\$98.62 with taxes) a night, single or double occupancy.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our past CSC Executive of Jamie McCrimmon (First Vice-President), Charlene Lucas (2nd Vice-President) and Lorrie Guillaume (Secretary-Treasurer), for a job well done last year. It was a pleasure working with these three individuals. There has been one change to our new Executive and I would like to welcome Doreen Clark as Secretary-Treasurer.

The following points will give you some insight into what Congress has been or will be working on:

- **Westjet 10% discount.** A "Conference" discount of 10% was available to any players, spectators, attendees at the Canadians if travelling by Westjet. Unfortunately, not everyone was aware of this opportunity so we have implemented a "3 person contact per Charter" rule so all such pertinent Congress information will reach as many people/players as possible to ensure everyone is so informed. If you have not already advised Doreen of your three contacts, please do so as soon as possible. We will once again implement the discount for the Canadians in Edmonton.

I checked into the added bonus of what I thought was "if we had 50 paid flights then the Association would be entitled to a free flight." This is not quite the case. The way it works is Westjet offers one complimentary ticket for every 50 seats booked. This ticket may be used for a draw or raffle item at the conference/convention only. CSC might be able to take advantage of this if we monitor the booking of flights more closely prior to our 2007 Canadians.

We can also take advantage of this discount for other tournaments i.e. Canadian, Alberta and Saskatchewan Opens, Craven Tournament, etc. For those organizers who believe there will be more than 10 people flying to their tournament, then you can take advantage of the Conference discount. Please let me know and we can arrange same.



- **CSC Logo.** We have a new Canadian Shuffleboard Congress logo! Thank you to all who submitted sample logos and to those players and charters who took the time to vote. Doreen and I are working on designing our letterhead and adding the logo to our website and newsletter, while also utilizing some sections of other logos. For example, the wording "The spirit of Canadian Shuffleboard" and the "CSC" initials.
- **17 point games.** For the first time in the history of doubles play at the Canadians, the games were to 17 rather than 21 points. I only heard positive feedback with this significant rule change, mostly commenting on how nice it was to not have such marathon events. The Executive would certainly welcome any Charter's or individual's comments/feedback.
- **3 way tie for 1st place.** There was a 3 way tie for first place at the completion of the double round robin in the Men's Singles. The tie was broken using the Congress Playoff Format, which will be posted to Congress' website soon.

If you do have an idea for a rule change on this matter, this must be submitted in writing to a member of the CSC Executive 90 days prior to the AGM in order to be voted on and effective at the 2007 Canadians.</li> <li>• <b>National Sponsorship.</b> Nothing to report at this time. However, if you do know of any company who may be interested in becoming a National shuffleboard sponsor, please provide me with their contact information.</li> <li>• <b>Rule Books.</b> It was decided at the AGM not to print new Rule Books at this time. We still have a small supply. It was also decided at the AGM to post the Rule Book on the website with any changes duly marked. In other words, you will be able to print an up-to-date Rule Book (to be posted to the website by March 1, 2007).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Hall of Fame.</b> There was lots of positive discussion about the CSC Hall of Fame at the AGM. The Committee formation has changed and I am pleased to advise that Rick Litman (SASA) is the Chairperson for 3 years. Rick has vast knowledge of shuffleboard and the players so it is of no surprise to have him as our Committee Chairperson. Also on the Committee for the next 2 years is Doug Grant (VISA) and Bill Cowan (SAA), and for one year is Rod Betker (SSA) and myself as current CSC President. Rick had further discussions with Committee members and many players during the week of the Canadians regarding the Hall of Fame and he has presented some recommendations for changes to our current policies and guidelines. We will keep you informed as these recommendations and proposed changes unfold.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Congress Weights.</b> In 1997, Brian Burchynsky arranged for 10 sets of Sunglo weights to be donated to Congress through different sponsors. We appear to have 7 sets of weights at this time. As you know, we need a minimum of 8 sets of weights. We need to, at this time, purchase another set of weights, and start considering replacing the current sets over the next couple of years. Any ideas? Any good contacts?
